Diploid Annual Ryegrass

Key Features

Centurion is an ideal annual ryegrass choice for dairies, beef and hay operations that need a ryegrass that can perform in multiple roles. In addition Centurion is an excellent choice for cover crop use. Centurion exhibits excellent winter hardiness and will not linger long into the summer. When fall planted it will survive the early onslaught of cold, wet weather to provide cover and offer biodiversity following non-grass crops. It has excellent forage yield as well and will provide ample amounts of high-quality early spring feed. In addition it has improved disease resistance to ensure above average yield and quality.

Management Keys

Centurion readily establishes on loosened bare soil or in close cut harvested fields for cover crop use. For typical new seeding applications apply at a rate of 20-25 lbs. per acre. For overseeding and cover crop use seed at a rate of 10-15 lbs. per acre for pastures and 3-5 lbs. per acre into thinning alfalfa stands. Use a Brillion seeder, a no-till drill or broadcast followed by a culti-packer. Seed to soil contact is critical to successful germination and establishment. For highest quality hay harvest at first boot stage.
