

Cache Meadow Brome



Key Features

Cache meadow brome is a long-lived perennial that is suited for dry land or irrigated pasture. Meadow brome can extend the grazing season as well as increase total forage production.

Management Keys

Meadow Brome can be challenging for many livestock and hay producers. Typically this sod-forming grass has a shortened grazing or harvest window compared to other cool-season grasses. Since meadow brome spreads rapidly by seeds and rhizomes it can become increasingly dominant in pastures and paddocks. Boosting stocking rates in spring and fall and either moderate use or rotating away from brome grass during the summer will help year-round utilization.
